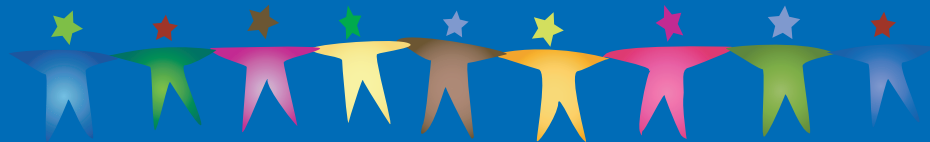




WITH INCLUSION IN MIND

People with mental health difficulties are some of the most excluded people in our society. Recent information has shown that they are the least likely group with a disability to be employed. Clearly a significant number of people are not able to maximise their abilities and talents in such an environment.

In the last few years a range of statutory duties have been laid on Local Authorities to promote the mental health and wellbeing of all their residents. In 2007 **With Inclusion in Mind** was published, as an aspirational guidance to local authorities to tackle this challenging agenda.

Some local authorities have rightly seen this as a corporate agenda and are starting to make real progress, some have found that some services have embraced this agenda but not all, while in a few local authorities other services thought this belonged to their Social Work service and have ignored it.

This conference is an opportunity to meet delegates from other services and other local authorities to learn how to drive this agenda forward. There will also be an opportunity to understand how it links with the high level single outcome agreements and how it can help all LAs address improvements. You will be asked to help produce a pocket guide to its relevance for use by all Councils.
